

## Resident Perspective

#### <u>Advantages</u>

- Very close to main teaching site and to hospitals so convenient to get to half days
- Opportunity to develop skills:
  - o removal of lumps & bumps
  - o IUD insertions
  - o home visits/palliative care
  - o mental health/counselling
  - o circumcisions
  - o obstetrics
- Fewer learners which means more opportunities for you as a resident!
- Great group of colleagues that make you feel part of the team
- A lot of independence, but support is always there if you need it (i.e. you have your own list of patients who are expecting to see you, but your preceptor is always available if needed)
- EMR paperless system with Mac computers

#### <u>Disadvantages</u>

- Clinic hours are less flexible than at the main teaching site
- Fewer specialist clinics to participate in compared to the CFFM (but there is an abundance of horizontal elective opportunities where you can explore special interests)
