<u>Advantages</u>

- So many resources and feels like an academic clinic with ample supports
- All the physicians and allied health are invested in your learning
- High exposure to obstetrics and gynecology
- Lots of locum opportunities for residents in the clinic upon graduation
- Several opportunities to do procedures
- Speciality clinics like breastfeeding clinic, Memory clinic
- Easy access to pharmacy staff and NPs to ask questions or learn skills like Paps, etc.
- Feels like a big family (potluck lunches, team building activity days)
- Free parking

Disadvantages

- You are often the only resident in the clinic (can be lonely and isolating)
- Not many opportunities to meet other residents compared to CFFM Victoria St.
- Not very reflective of many practices in the future because this clinic is so well run and supplied

The Refugee Clinic of Community Healthcaring KW is a busy practice of 5000+ patients of all ages. We are a multidisciplinary clinic of 6 full and part time GPs, as well as a part-time pediatrician, NPs, nurses, translators, social workers, settlement workers and other staff. In operation since 2013, we believe we are the largest refugee clinic in Canada by patient volume.

We mix pre-booked appointments with urgent same-day appointments. We have high volumes of prenatal and newborn care, mental health care, women's health, chronic disease and poverty medicine. We provide culturally-sensitive, trauma-informed care.
