



Resident Perspectives

<u>Advantages</u>

- Several opportunities to expand your experience and knowledge beyond typical clinic work
- A fantastic mid size site where you get the feel of working in a big family health whilst also having a community office feel.
- All the staff are happy to have residents join them depending on their interests and will specifically pull learners to be a part of interesting cases.
- A very wide variety and diversity of staff so resident can get exposed to different styles of practice and expertise
- The preceptors are incredibly knowledgeable, informative and approachable!
- Learn about practise management early, good clinical exposure, excellent attendings and staff

Disadvantages

- 1-2 Learners are present at a given time, so there is not much resident-to-resident interaction
- Can be a longer drive during blocks such as integrated where clinics can be in Waterloo so you have to manage your time appropriately
- There is not a heavy focus on procedures at this site, hence if that is your interest you may need to supplement your learning with horizontals.
