# The Centre for Family Medicine – Wellesley

Being part of the FHT, patients at this office have access to all the speciality clinics and IHPs.
- Three physicians work out of this office and one resident may be placed at this location with Dr. Moore and Dr. Clarke under a shared preceptorship.

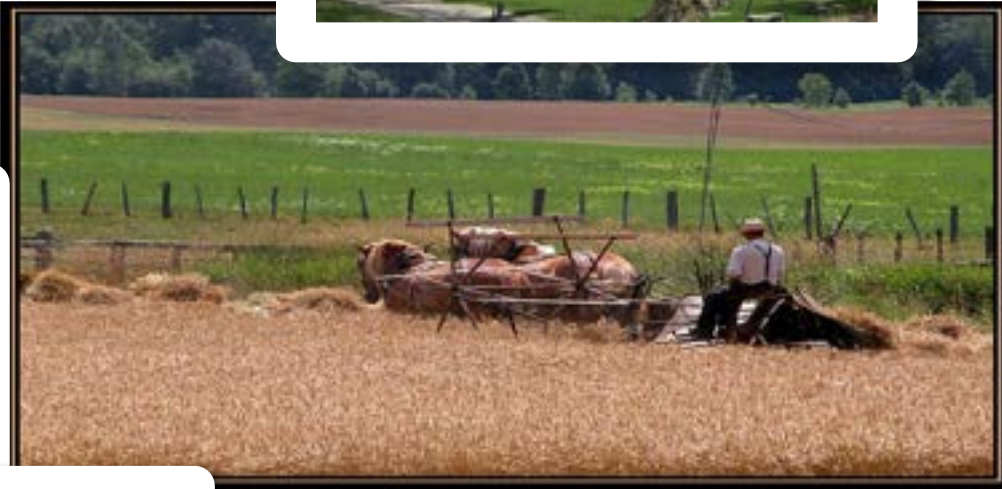
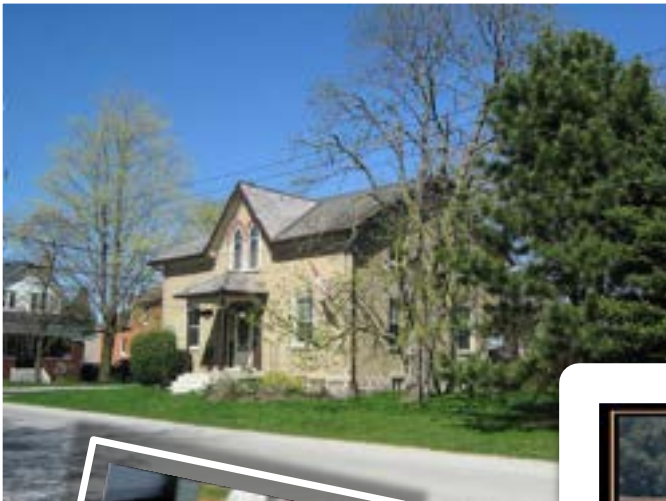
# Resident Perspectives

## Advantages

- outside of the city, more rural population
- gain experience with minor procedures ex. lesion removal, I&D abscess, laceration repair
- opportunities for home visits and palliative care/supportive care visits
- the patients are very receptive and welcoming to learners
- opportunity to be involved in teaching of the medical students who do rotations here
- most of the time there is only one resident at the site, which means tons of opportunity to do procedures, see interesting cases
- very welcoming staff, fun environment to work in, small site so get to know staff very well

## Disadvantages

- approximately 30 minute drive from Kitchener/Waterloo
- not as much contact with fellow residents
- possibly higher workload within the rural/small clinic context (does offer more independence than the average resident though!)
